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Keynote Speaker





LARISSA ANDERSON | Head Softball Coach | University of Missouri

As Anderson enters year seven in Mid-Missouri that new era has already gotten off to a successful start, and her ability to change the culture of the program in such a short time was a big reason why. Anderson has led Mizzou to a 217-115 record over her six seasons and owns a career record of 350-189-1 as a head coach.

In her time at the helm of the Tigers, Anderson has steered Missouri to five NCAA Regional appearances and a pair of Super Regionals. She has led the Tigers to 35 or more wins each season at Mizzou – in all but the COVID-19 shortened 2020 season.

Missouri most recently hosted a Regional and Super Regional in 2024 after home postseason runs in 2021 (Regional and Super Regional) and 2022 (Regional).

Anderson has been part of eight NFCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year award winners, including seven as an assistant or associate head coach and one as the head coach.

In 17 seasons at Hofstra, she helped the Pride to a 610-267-2 (.695) record). Before taking over as head coach from Hall of Famer Bill Edwards, Anderson spent 13 seasons on the Hofstra staff as an assistant, including the last 10 as the associate head coach, helping the program to 10 NCAA Tournament appearances and 10 CAA titles. As associate head coach, she helped Hofstra win 24 NCAA Tournament games and make six appearances in the regional finals.

Prior to joining the Hofstra staff, Anderson served as an assistant coach for two seasons at LIU Post, where she helped the Pioneers to a combined 75-33 record, including a school-record 42 wins during the 2000 season. She assisted in all facets of the program at LIU Post and oversaw coaching the pitchers and catchers. Her efforts helped the Pioneers to the 13th-best team earned run average in Division II (1.11) in 2001. She was also part of a Post staff that received the Northeast Region Division II Coaching Staff of the Year award from the NFCA in 2000.

Anderson spent one season as an assistant coach at Gannon University in 1998, after being named a regional All-American outfielder in 1997. She graduated from Gannon in 1997 with a bachelor's of science degree in therapeutic recreation.

An active NFCA member, Anderson was elected NFCA President on Oct. 25, 2022, and is one of eight members who were voted to the NFCA's Board of Directors.

She is married to former Hofstra Baseball Coach Patrick Anderson, who manages the St. Louis Cardinals' Class A affiliate in Peoria, Illinois.

DR. BENNETT BOGGS | Commissioner of the Department of Higher Education & Workforce Development

Dr. Boggs comes to Missouri with an extensive background in higher education. He hails from the Colorado Department of Higher Education where he served as the Deputy Executive Director as well as the Chief of Staff to the Executive Director. Prior to his role in Colorado, Dr. Boggs worked across many areas of higher education, including the National Conference of State Legislatures, the Kentucky Education Professional Standards Board, the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education, and the Kentucky General Assembly. Dr. Boggs also has experience working within both public and private institutions of higher education.

Dr. Boggs earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from Wake Forest University, a master's of education from The College of William and Mary, a Ph.D. in Higher Education Policy Studies from the University of Virginia and completed the Institute for Management and Leadership in Education at the Graduate School of Education at Harvard University.



DR. BETSY JOHNSON | Director, Student Financial Aid & Scholarships | Bowling Green State University

Dr. Betsy Johnson has been in financial aid for over 27 years. She is currently Director of Student Financial Aid and Scholarships and has been there over 8 ½ years. Prior to that Betsy was at Owens Community College in Toledo, Ohio over 15 years serving as Director of Financial Aid for several years before becoming VP of Enrollment Management there. Betsy is currently the President of MASFAA and is looking to serving the membership this year! She was elected as Treasurer Elect in 2021 and served in numerous Chair roles for MASFAA over the years. Betsy has also been extremely active with the Ohio Association of Student

Financial Aid Administrators and served on the executive board for close to 20 years and was President of OASFAA in 2007-2008. She has also been a NASFAA Standards of Excellence Team Lead, along with a SOE Peer Reviewer since 2007. Betsy received the MASFAA State Leadership Award in 2019, the OASFAA Alex Murdoch Award in 2010 and the OASFAA James W. White Award in 2018. Betsy earned her PhD from the University of Toledo, her M.Ed. from Ohio University, and her BS from Clarion University of Pennsylvania. Betsy is an avid Pittsburgh sports fan and has two children, her daughter who just started "adulting" and is an Athletic Trainer at a high school in Ohio and her son is a junior in BGSU's nursing program.

TRENT BALL | Senior Director, Postsecondary Equity and Attainment | Missouri College and Career Attainment Network (MOCAN)

Mr. Trent Ball serves as the inaugural Senior Director, Postsecondary Equity and Attainment, for the Missouri College and Career Attainment Network (MOCAN). MOCAN exists to ensure Missouri students who could most benefit from education beyond high school have what they need to earn a credential leading to a rewarding career. MOCAN is a network of institutions, organizations, and professionals committed to greater equity in college and career access, affordability, and completion. By working for change at the institutional and systems levels, MOCAN aspires to create a postsecondary education system where outcomes are no longer predictable by race or socio-economic status.

As Senior Director, Mr. Ball leads MOCAN's postsecondary attainment strategy including the Postsecondary Equity Network (PEN), as well as the organization's research agenda and advocacy work. Prior to joining MOCAN, Trent retired from Southeast Missouri State University in May 2022 and holds the title Associate Provost Emeritus. During his tenure at Southeast, he provided leadership and management of the Academic Support Centers, including Educational Access Programs, Learning Assistance Programs, and the TRIO Programs (McNair Scholars and Student Support Services).



DR. D'ANDRE BRADDIX | Executive Director of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion | St. Louis Community College

Dr. D'Andre Braddix is the Executive Director of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion at St. Louis Community College (STLCC). In this role, Dr. Braddix is responsible for providing strategic vision and direction for district-wide diversity and inclusion initiatives; he also serves as a liaison to community partners and constituents on a wide array of diversity and equity issues. Prior to joining STLCC, Dr. Braddix served as Associate Vice Provost & Dean of Students, Senior Equity Officer, and Clinical Assistant Professor of Education at the University of Missouri-St. Louis.

Dr. Braddix currently serves as co-chair for Missouri's Postsecondary Equity Network – a coalition of more than 20 higher education institutions and community partners working to eliminate equity gaps in degree completion for low-income and BILPOC students. Additionally, Dr. Braddix serves as a consultant to the American Society of Criminology, where he supports their organizational efforts to infuse diversity, equity, and inclusion principles into their policies and practices.

Stephanie Petsch will be the President of the Michigan Student Financial Aid Association (MSFAA) in the 2025 year. She has worked at Eastern Michigan University (EMU) for 26 years. Currently, she is the Assistant Director and manages the Pell grant program, Michigan Future Educators programs, the Phone Center, and supervises the Financial Aid Advisors. She has been involved in both MSFAA and MASFAA for several years as a committee member and Co-Chairs. She is a graduate of EMU and has worked in Collections, Admission, and Continuing Education before settling down in Financial Aid.



DR. ALEXANDER JORDAN | Executive Director of Financial Aid | Ashland University

Dr. Alexander Jordan currently serves as the Executive Director of Financial Aid at Ashland University. In his role, he focuses heavily on compliance, utilizing innovation to streamline processes and services to students, and overseeing a team that serves all student populations including the largest Correctional Education program in the country. With close to 10 years of experience in higher education, almost exclusively in financial aid, Alex also serves as the President of the Ohio Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators (OASFAA). Alex earned his Masters of Education in Higher Education & Student Affairs as well as his Ph.D. in Higher Education Administration from the University of South Carolina where his dissertation

focused on veterans and their transition from military service to community college. He is currently pursuing his MBA with dual specializations in Business Analytics and Human Resource Management.
